Fawkes and his friends got caught and we imprisoned on 5 th November 1605. The King wanted to celebrate so he created Bonfire Night, which we celebrate on 5 th November every year. Put Fawkes on the class timeline, and remind children he lived 'a long time ago,' 'in the past.'
